DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2024

The directors present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 October 2024.

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'. Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of the profit or loss of the Company for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies for the Company's financial statements and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

The directors are responsible for the maintenance and integrity of the corporate and financial information included on the Company's website. Legislation in the United Kingdom governing the preparation and dissemination of financial statements and other information included in Directors' reports may differ from legislation in other jurisdictions.

Principal activity

The Company buys lines of whisky in barrels from Scottish distilleries, usually shortly after they have been laid down to mature. It then sells the whisky by the litre to its clients through its custom-built online trading platform, WhiskyInvestDirect.com. Clients can then buy and sell their whisky as it matures, and industry partners can make bulk trade bids to buy stock for their blending requirements. The Company provides custody services to clients via bonded warehouses and earns commissions on each trade made on its platform.

DIRECTORS' REPORT (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2024

Business review

In the prior year ending 31 October 2023 liquid supply was tight and industry demand for mature spirit from our platform was high. Distillers were reluctant to sell to third parties, including us. This reduced the volume of stock held on the platform but increased trading commissions as the trade used the platform to replenish stocks. This was expected and is part of the normal cycle of the Scotch whisky business.

We noted in last year's outlook that "there are early signs of a slowdown", and this proved correct. During the year to 31 October 2024 the demand for bottled Scotch whisky fell and prices reduced globally. This impacted the Company in two ways: supplies of new whisky became more available; and demand for mature spirit decreased.

Taking advantage of the increased supply, the Company launched 1.8m LPA of new make spirit on the platform during the year (2023: 1.2m LPA). Conversely, lower demand saw the number of bulk trade bids from industry partners decline significantly to 15 (2023: 128), with 0.2m LPA (2023: 2.9m LPA) being sold off the platform to the trade.

With supply recovering WhiskyInvestDirect ended the year with 12.4m LPA (2023: 10.9m LPA) of maturing whisky on the platform, up 14% from last year.

Topline turnover grew 128% to £15.9m (2023: £7.0m), driven by the increased volume of whisky launched on the platform. Greater client investment in whisky also help custody fee income to rise by 9%, but the decline in bulk trade bids resulted in a 42% drop in commission revenue.

Profit before tax was £0.93m (2023: £1.26m).

The number of clients paying custody fees was up 3% while deposits decreased 55% to £10.4m (2023: £23.4m). Withdrawals decreased 41% to £10.9m (2023: £18.3m) following the prior year of profit taking by clients.

Administration costs were up 15% as we continued to expand the team and moved into a new office.

Outlook

After a year of a reset in prices following strong growth, there are some recent signs that the market may be near the bottom of the cycle and the industry has started its recovery. We are already seeing an increase in the desire of distillers to sell new-make spirit in 2025. However, the industry remains cautious following the increase in UK alcohol duties in February 2025, and the unpredictable impact of international events on export markets. It will likely take until the end of 2025 before supply and demand come back into balance.

In April 2025 the Company raised an additional £1m of share capital. This is a great vote of confidence in the business, and ensures that the Company has the working capital to take advantage of opportunities that may present themselves in this part of the cycle.

WhiskyInvestDirect is focusing on growing the investor client base along with bringing on board new distillery partners. The underlying health of the business remains strong and our relationships and role within the industry gets further cemented each year.

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Whiskyinvestdirect Limited (the 'Company') for the year ended 31 October 2024, which comprise the Statement of income and retained earnings, the Statement of financial position and the related notes, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Misstatements can arise from fraud or error and are considered material if, individually or in the aggregate, they could reasonably be expected to influence the economic decisions of users taken on the basis of these financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2024

1. General information

WhiskyInvestDirect Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registration number is 09068458 and registered office address is 7th Floor, 3 Shortlands, London, W6 8DA.

These financial statements have been presented in pounds sterling, rounded to the nearest pound, as this is the currency of the primary economic environment in which it operates.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland' and the requirements of the Companies Act 2006. The disclosure requirements of Section 1A of FRS 102 have been applied other than where additional disclosure is required to show a true and fair view.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

2.2 Going concern

The directors have considered the on-going situation with regard to the current economic downturn as part of their going concern assessment. The view of the directors is that the Company is well placed to negotiate the unique set of conditions currently facing the UK economy and has sufficient cash in order to continue to meet its liabilities as they fall due.

The Company has a strong cash position at the year end and at the time of signing. The directors have prudently assessed the level of outgoings in the business against the available cash and concluded there is sufficient headroom to enable the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due for a period of at least 12 months from the financial statements being signed.

After consideration of all factors, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

2.3 Turnover recognition

Turnover represents the sale of whisky and the related services as part of a composite supply of services to customers. Turnover is recognised at the point of sale.

Where there is an element in the initial sale price that relates to the ownership of the casks by the Company, this element is spread over the period of time the Company expects to own those casks for the purposes of customers storing that whisky.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 OCTOBER 2024

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.4 Current and Deferred Taxation

The tax expense for the period comprises current and deferred tax. Tax is recognised in the profit and loss account, except that a change attributable to an item of income or expense recognised as other comprehensive income is also recognised directly in other comprehensive income.

The current tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the Company operates and generates taxable income.

Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements and on unused tax losses or tax credits in the Company. Deferred tax is determined using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date. The carrying amount of deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and a valuation allowance is set up against deferred tax assets so that the net carrying amount equals the highest amount that is more likely than not to be recovered based on current or future taxable profit. Deferred tax liabilities are presented within provisions for liabilities on the balance sheet.

2.5 Foreign currency transactions and balances

Functional and presentation currency

The Company's functional and presentational currency is GBP.

Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the spot exchange rates at the dates of the transactions.

At each period end foreign currency monetary items are translated using the closing rate. Non-monetary items measured at historical cost are translated using the exchange rate at the date of the transaction and non-monetary items measured at fair value are measured using the exchange rate when fair value was determined.

Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of transactions and from the translation at period-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognised in profit or loss except when deferred in other comprehensive income as qualifying cash flow hedges.

Foreign exchange gains and losses that relate to borrowings and cash and cash equivalents are presented in the Statement of income and retained earnings within 'finance income or costs'. All other foreign exchange gains and losses are presented in profit or loss within 'other operating income'.

2.6 Operating leases: the Company as lessee

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

Benefits received and receivable as an incentive to sign an operating lease are recognised on a straight-line basis over the lease term, unless another systematic basis is representative of the time pattern of the lessee's benefit from the use of the leased asset.

2.7 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in profit or loss using the effective interest method.

2.8 Pensions

Defined contribution pension plan

The Company operates a defined contribution plan for its employees. A defined contribution plan is a pension plan under which the Company pays fixed contributions into a separate entity. Once the contributions have been paid the Company has no further payment obligations.

The contributions are recognised as an expense in profit or loss when they fall due. Amounts not paid are shown in accruals as a liability in the Statement of financial position. The assets of the plan are held separately from the Company in independently administered funds.

2.9 Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets under the cost model are stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. Historical cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

Depreciation is charged so as to allocate the cost of assets less their residual value over their estimated useful lives, using the straight-line method.

Depreciation is provided on the following basis:

Casks - 15 years
Fixtures and fittings - 4 years
Computer equipment - 3 years

The assets' residual values, useful lives and depreciation methods are reviewed, and adjusted prospectively if appropriate, or if there is an indication of a significant change since the last reporting date.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing the proceeds with the carrying amount and are recognised in profit or loss.

2.10 Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, being the estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost is based on the cost of purchase on a first in, first out basis.

At each reporting date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stock is impaired, the carrying amount is reduced to its selling price les costs to complete and sell. The impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

2.11 Debtors

Short-term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.12 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

2.13 Creditors

Short-term creditors are measured at the transaction price. Other financial liabilities, including bank loans, are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

2.14 Reserves

Called up share capital represents the nominal value of shares that have been issued.

Share premium account includes any premiums received on the issue of share capital. Transaction costs associated with the issuing of shares are deducted from the share premium.

Profit and loss account includes all current and prior period profits and losses.

2.15 Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments.

Redeemable preference shares are treated as non-current loans and borrowings, which is in accordance with FRS 102.

2.16 Client accounts

The Company operates separately designated client accounts in each currency in which the company trades. Customers are only able to purchase whisky once the Company has received cleared money and this money is paid to and held in the separately designated financial accounts. As these amounts are held within designated client accounts and beneficial entitlement is retained by the customers, these cash balances are not included in the balance sheet of the Company.

The average monthly number of employees, including directors, during the year was 10 (2023 - 9).

10. Reedemable Preference Shares

The redeemable preference shares are redeemable at the option of the holder between 1 May 2025 and 31 May 2025. They are redeemable at £1 per share together with any unpaid cumulative preference dividend at the time of redemption and carry no voting rights.

The holder has the right to purchase one ordinary share of £0.01 each per preference share redeemed between 1 May 2025 and 31 May 2025 for consideration of £1 each.

If the shares are not redeemed by the holder during either of the periods then the Company can enforce redemption after 31 May 2025.

11. Related party transactions

Summary of transactions with directors and key management

During the year the directors made personal purchases of whisky from the Company totalling £7,751 (2023 - £4,680) and sales of whisky to the Company totalling £84,723 (2023 - £57,018) which have been settled as normal clients paying in personal funds.

In addition, during the year the directors made personal purchases of bottled whisky from the company totalling £233 (2023 - £759) which have been settled as normal clients paying in personal funds.

During the year other related parties made purchases of whisky from the Company of £1,454 (2023 - £2,270) which have been settled as normal clients paying in personal funds and sales of whisky to the Company totalling £3,887 (2023-£48,290).

Dividends were paid to the directors and key management who held preference shares at the year end. The amount of dividends paid to directors and key management was £2,070 (2023 - £2,070).

Dividends were paid to other related parties who held preference shares at the year end. The amount of dividends paid to other related parties was £1,545 (2023 - £1,545).

Summary of transactions with companies under common directorship

During the year the company had recharge agreements in place with Galmarley Limited. These recharges have been reflected in the accounts against the corresponding expenditure. In relation to recharges the Company paid £112,897 (2023 - £114,964) and received £Nil (2023 - £524).

The Company paid £Nil (2023 - £1,115) to Galmarley Limited in order to settle a debt with Galmarley's subsidiary, Bullionvault Limited.

At the balance sheet date the amount due to Galmarley Limited was £12,508 (2023 - £7,791).

The amount outstanding at the balance sheet date owed to the Company by James Eadie Limited was £50,000 (2023 - £75,000).

During the year the company received £Nil (2023 - £72) from Angus Dundee Distillers plc from the sale of sample stock.
